


- Historical agreement of social partners on the amount of minimal salary in

 - Impact on some provisions of Labor Code and deadlines



GDP





In summary, for the entire year 2022, GDP reached a nominal volume of 107.7 billion euro

At constant prices (not seasonally adjusted), it grew by 1.7%.

At the same time, the performance of the economy was 1.2% higher than just before the pandemic (comparison with 2019).

Inflation







On average, for the entire year 2022, consumer prices increased by 12.8% year-on-year. Last year's annual inflation thus surpassed the previous maximum from 2000, when price growth reached 12%.


In **February 2023**, inflation again reached the level of the previous maximum at the level of **15.4%**.

Unemployment







On average, for the entire year 2022, there were 170.4 thousand people without work, year-on-year this number decreased by more than 17 thousand people (by 9.2%).

The unemployment rate in the Slovak Republic reached 6.1% in 2022, which was less than in 2021, when the unemployment rate reached 6.8%.

Average monthly wages





The average nominal monthly salary of an employee in the Slovak economy reached 1,304 euros in 2022.



The real wage fell by 4.5%. The last time we saw a drop in real wages was immediately after the financial crisis, i.e. in 2011 and 2012.

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING 2023



- Sectorial CA for the field of electro technical industry:
 - in 2023, only the salary part is negotiated,
 - request for an average increase in tariff classes by 19.95%.
- Sectorial CA of the metallurgical industry:
 - required average wage growth of 13.81%,
 - important provisions of the KZVS regulating the protection of employees before the end of the employment relationship, the maximum limit of agency employees or employees' entitlement to retraining and education in the event of the introduction of technological changes.



- Sectorial CA of the glass industry:
 - in 2023, only the salary part was negotiated,
 - the negotiated average increase in wage grades by 9.16%,
 - the first level at EUR 668 and the 6th level at EUR 1068.
- Sectorial CA for public and state service (HaZZ):
 - an agreed increase in wages by 7% from 1.1.2023 and by another 10% from 1.9.2023.
- Sectorial CA for housing management:
 - in 2023, only the salary part is negotiated,
 - required increase average increase of tariff classes by 20.6%.
